

Syntactic And Phonological Processing In Children With Language Impairments, Children With Reading Disabilities And Normally Achieving Children

Children with specific language impairment (SLI) have difficulties with oral abilities mentioned above (grammar and syntax, semantics, and phonological skills). They are at increased risk of reading difficulties, relative to children with no history of SLI. Many children with SLI go on to achieve normally in school, and those with ongoing difficulties speaking normally achieving readers except that the bilingual children had significantly .
